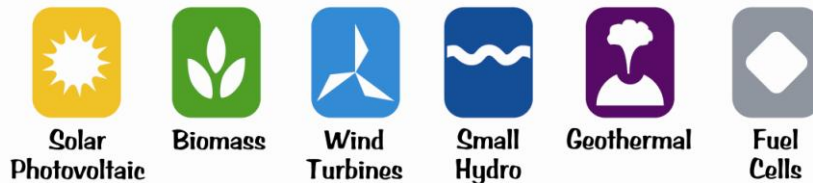


Five Year Predictions !?!
